How many needs are there?

Back to the nature of God

For the whole law is fulfilled in one word, you shall love your neighbor as yourself.

-Galatians 5:14

...fulfill the Royal Law according to the scripture, you shall love your neighbor as yourself.

-James 2:8

For the commandments, "You shall not commit adultery, you shall not murder, you shall not steal, you shall not covet," and any other commandment, are summed up in this one word: you shall love your neighbor as yourself.

-Romans 13:9

The greatest commandment:

love God and love your neighbor... - Matthew 22:37-40

All commandments "summed up" in:

"love your neighbor as yourself."

the consummate Book of the understatement



Definitions are important!

love? - 'agape' - "a steadfast, sacrificial zeal..." neighbor? - 'plesion' -one who lives near

The "humanity" counterfeit of agape

The notion that true love is loving the world or loving humanity: where we get in a big circle, hold hands and sing songs about loving the world and everybody tears up





"It is easier to be enthusiastic about Humanity with a capital 'H' than it is to love individual men and women, especially those who are uninteresting, exasperating, depraved, or otherwise unattractive. Loving everybody in general may be an excuse for loving nobody in particular." -C.S. Lewis

What if Jesus said precisely what he meant?




