- (2) A LORD IS ONE WHO HAS AUTHORITY.
- (3) A LORD ISSUES COMMANDS WHICH MUST BE OBEYED.
- (4) A LORD WILL NOT TOLERATE SLAVES WHO PLACE THEIR OWN WILL ABOVE HIS OWN WILL.
- (5) A LORD IS NOT ONLY HEARD BY HIS SLAVES BUT ALSO OBEYED BY HIS SLAVES.
- (6) WHOM YOU CALL LORD DOES NOT ALWAYS SHOW WHO IS YOUR REAL LORD.
- (7) IN KNOWING WHO IS YOUR REAL LORD, ACTION SPEAKS LOUDER THAN WORDS.
- (8) EVEN JESUS PLACED THE FATHER'S WILL ABOVE HIS OWN.
- (9) A LORD'S DESIRES REPLACES A SLAVE'S DESIRES.
- (10) A LORD WILL BLESS THE SLAVE WHO FULFILLS THE LORD'S WILL.
- (11) A LORD WILL CURSE THE SLAVE WHO FULFILLS THE SLAVE'S OWN WILL.

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
